## **Maintaining Your Check Cashing License**

**Posting the license:** The licensee must conspicuously post their original license and/or certificate for public display at each physical location. No person or other entity may engage in the business of either Level I or Level II check-cashing service without first obtaining a license. The licensee shall post a license and/or certificate to engage in the business of check cashing services at each location licensed pursuant to this S.C. Code of Laws Title 34 Chapter 41.

<u>Check Cashing Fee form</u>: A licensee shall ensure that in every location conducting business under a license issued, there is posted conspicuously and at all times displayed a Check Cashing Fee form stating the fees charged for cashing checks, drafts, and money orders. A licensee further shall ensure that notice of the fees currently charged at every location is filed with the board.
